Assignments:

- <u>Project Proposal</u>: DUE MAY 20<sup>th</sup> Identify an approach, like writer's workshop, or a specific tool, strategy, text/text set from a session at the conference that inspires you to learn more. Pick one of the three Final Project models (see below). Write a 2-page project proposal that
  - 1. **Describes** the selected approach, tool, strategy, or text set that you learned about at the conference
  - 2. **Explains** how this idea is new to you or extends or refines what you are already doing.
  - 3. Explains how you would like to implement this idea in one of the three options.
- 2. Final Project

Options (Choose 1): Unit Plan, Professional Development Leadership Plan, Paper **NOTE:** All options request that you draw from professional literature to extend and deepen your understanding beyond the scope of the conference. ## Final Project Option 1: Unit Plan

- 1. Design a 2-week (minimum) sequence of lessons around a theme that integrates the focal strategy.
- 2. Write daily lessons with essential questions, state standards, materials, procedures, and teacher talk.
- 3. Write an overview calendar
- 4. Write a 3-page rationale that explains the rationale, goals, and rich description of your use of the strategies based on your readings. Cite at least 3 readings

# Final Project Option 2: Professional Development Leadership Plan

- 1. Design a plan to share a specific strategy that you learned about or presented on to your colleagues in your district.
- 2. Plan a 6-hour PD sequence (6 1-hour, 3 2-hour, etc.) to support meaningful learning across time.
- 3. Write an overview calendar
- 4. Write session lesson plans with essential questions, state standards, materials, procedures, and teacher talk,
- 5. Write a 3-page rationale that explains the rationale, goals, and rich description of your use of the strategies based on your readings. Cite at least 3 readings

# Final Project Option 3: Paper Options

- 1. Several of the sessions are based on novels. If there is a text or text set (e.g. selection of children's literature on a theme, for example) that is new to you and inspires you, you can read them and write a 5-page paper analyzing the text and how you might use it in the classroom.
- 2. The theme of the conference is on the power of place, and many sessions draw upon that theme. Write a 5-page paper around the theme of the power of place as a site of learning in ELA. To do so, extend your thinking by reading and citing at least three academic articles that address place-based education in ELA or broadly.
- 3. Develop your own thesis on a concept from the conference. Write a 5-page paper developing your thesis. Extend your thinking by reading and citing at least three academic articles that address this thesis.
